Each household may take up to five bags of combustible waste to the collection point each collection day. Tie the designated bag and place it in the designated area.

Take your waste in the designated bag to the collection area by 8:30 a.m. on the collection day.

Category **Example items** Disposal method Food waste / waste Remove excess liquid from kitchen refuse. Wood, branches Cloth, leather waste **Plastic products** Stained containers Harden excess cooking oil or soak it up with paper or cloth. Leftover food, grass, CD cases Clothing, shoes, bags Woodchips, small Small branches must be no more than 50cm in length and 5cm in thickness and tied up in bundles Disposable lighters Hangers / buckets. etc Combustible when left at the collection point. However, to dispose of more than five bundles at once, please bring them to a collection center. waste Paper diapers must have excrement removed before disposal Plastic products without a recycle mark, tissue paper, toilet paper, and post displaying personal information are classified as combustible waste. • Remove the caps from empty bottles and rinse them with water. **Empty bottles** Glass **Bottles**, glass Cups, glass sheets, (Metal and plastic caps must be disposed of separately.) Products processed with aluminium (the back side will be silver colored) should be disposed of as and cartons • Dispose of any paper product that is badly stained as combustible waste. Dispose of by folding and putting into piles no more than 50cm in length or width and binding with Newspapers, Fliers Cardboard Magazines Newspapers, (Newspaper and fliers may also be disposed of in paper bags from newspaper delivery shops.) magazines, Make each bundle about 30cm tall. cardboard Bundle newspapers (fliers), magazines and cardboard separately. 












Make use of the recyclable collection activities by local groups!

- \odot Children's groups and other local groups register with the city and independently collect household recyclable waste.
- These groups are awarded subsidies based on the quantity of materials they are able to gather.

- Spray cans and gas cylinders for tabletop stoves can explode, so always make sure they are completely empty.
- Wrap sharp objects like blades in newspaper or something similar when disposing of them to prevent injury.
- Some small household appliances can also be disposed of in boxes at certain collection points.
